KEY ROLES

- Teaching English to foreign students
- Delivery and support of the Activities Programme

Specific Responsibilities

Teaching

- Teach English to foreign students aged 11 -17 for 15 contact hours per week
- Plan, prepare and teach classes in accordance with the recommended methodology as laid out in the international language holidays (ilh) teachers' handbook and following the ilh syllabus
- Assist with the testing of new students
- Complete all class registers and records on a daily basis
- Attend course and training meetings as required – usually once a week
- Ensure students have a positive learning experience

Activities Programme

- Make sure you are familiar with activities procedures and excursions destinations
- Attend excursion briefings prior to half-day and full-day excursions
- Supervise and be actively involved in organising 3 activities per week
- Supervise and actively participate in one afternoon excursion per week. *On two occasions during the course, the half-day excursion is followed directly by an evening barbecue*
- Supervise and actively participate in one full-day excursion every week
- Ensure that students have a positive experience

Pre-course

- Attend the induction at Ipswich School on the Friday or Saturday before the start of the course
- Successfully complete a short on-line **Safeguarding** course and provide certificate

General Accountabilities and Responsibilities

Ensure compliance with and actively promote Health and Safety at work legislation, CESC and ilh H&S policies and procedures, Equal Opportunities, Prevent and Child Protection & Safeguarding policies and ilh Code of Conduct.

Comply with the Data Protection Act 1998 (all employees of CESC and ilh will not disclose or make use of, for their private advantage, any information held on manual or computer records, which are not available to the public, however acquired).
