Tour of Colchester

Take a tour around Britain's first city and former capital of Roman Britain and see ruins and buildings which date back over 2000 years. Walk through Castle Park and see Colchester Castle and enjoy the displays in Hollytrees Museum, and find out about wildlife and climate change in the Natural History Museum. End your tour in the centre of town to enjoy a bit of shopping at some of the UK's most popular retail stores.



Tour of Ipswich

Take a tour around one of the oldest English towns and see its historical architecture, modern waterfront and beautiful large parks. Visit Wolsey Art Gallery to see the collection of Constable and Gainsborough paintings and drawings. Explore the modern art and design exhibitions at Ipswich Art Gallery, and discover local Anglo-Saxon artefacts, relics from Ancient Egypt and natural history exhibits at The Victorian Natural History Gallery. End your tour with a bit of shopping at some of the UK's most popular retail stores.



Trip to Flatford

Explore the area made famous by the 18th-century paintings of John Constable, England's leading landscape artist of the time. See Flatford Mill, Willy Lott's House, and the site of The Hay Wain painting. You can hire a wooden paddle boat to take you down the Stour River or enjoy a freshly made snack from the tea room under the trees. End your trip in the gift shop and send a postcard to a loved one from the Royal Mail post box outside.



Colchester Zoo

Colchester Zoo is rated the 11th best zoo around the world and one of the top 2 zoos in the UK on TripAdvisor. Take a walk around the Zoo and discover 220 species of animals from around the world, including Komodo Dragons from Tropical Indonesia to white rhino and lions from the African bush. If you're feeling brave you can feed a giraffe or elephant, or visit the farm area and feed goats and sheep. You can relax and enjoy a snack in one of the many restaurants or picnic sites, or take a free train ride around part of the zoo. There is something for everyone!



Firstsite

Firstsite is a visual arts organisation which supports new art, schools' art, local and regional artists, and offers learning opportunities. Firstsite started in 1994 in Colchester's 18th century Minories building and had thousands of visitors. It was so popular that the organisation grew too big for the building so in 2003 a worldwide architectural competition was organised. In September 2011 Firstsite moved to its new modern venue, which was designed by the winner - Uruguayan architect Rafael Viñoly. The gallery is open all year for you to discover exciting exhibitions, films, workshops and events indoor and outdoor, and to enjoy the café and shop.



Mersea Island

Mersea is a small island near Colchester with a population of just under 7000 but with lots of things to do. You can go shopping in the traditional fishing village or visit the Mersea Island Museum to see Roman artefacts, enjoy delicious 'fish 'n chips' or the island's famous oysters, view birds and seals in the Blackwater Estuary on a boat ride, swim in the North sea, go crabbing or walk along the pebble beach collecting shells and fossils and taking photos of the colourful beach huts. We'll visit Essex Outdoor for some exciting adventure activities when we play *It's a Knockout*.
